

## **WOMEN'S WORD WALL**

Depending on the age of the student, either have students identify which special words should go on their “women’s word wall” while reading the book or use our printable pre-determined set of words [HERE](#). Individually or in partners, students can write out the definition of the word to be posted on a “women’s word wall” bulletin board and complete [THIS](#) worksheet. Older students can investigate the roots of the words and generate a list of antonyms. After they complete the word wall, have kids put sticky notes identifying each woman they think the word connects with their life and explain their reasoning.
